I can't imagine a person better suited to the board of the WFSJ than Sunny Bains. We met at Boston University when we were both studying science journalism, but she'd actually been working as a tech journalist for several years before that, publishing her own magazine about holography at 19 and writing for *New Scientist* before she turned 21. I was always very jealous.

Her main contribution has been to write about emerging technologies in a deep and systematic way, engagingly and deeply accurate. Sunny has delved into fields such as imaging and displays, computer hardware, and machine intelligence, acquiring a ferocious expertise in the science as well as the conveying of it to others. Since the late 1990s she's been teaching her techniques to students, including at UC Berkeley, Imperial College London, and UCL, and—most recently—she published a book that explains her methods through Oxford University Press.

Sunny is a serious and dedicated professional who been active in both the NASW and ABSW over the years. She's a paragon of our field, a journalist of integrity and honesty, and a good person—and she has lived in the US, UK, and Canada and has always had a very international outlook.
